
Hello San Diego chapter members,

Well hunting season is in the bag except for Mexico. I'm hoping everyone was able to get out and enjoy your-self with your hunting pals and your dogs. Time to put the decoys, etc. away and dust off the bucket of retrieving dummies. Also a good time to get your dog steady again.

There are two tests this Spring. So Cal is an NA only test March 18 - 20 and the combined San Diego/Inland Empire test is April 22 - 24. Both will be at Prado Recreation. On April 9th we will have our training day at Prado and will be conducting a Mock Test. For those of you that are running in NA this is a valuable training day so please mark your calendars.

Our Rattlesnake Avoidance training is scheduled for Saturday March 26th at the Jamul Veterinary Hospital on HWY 94 in Jamul (same location as last year). This year when you make your reservation with Mark Miller the guy in charge of our clinic you will also have the opportunity get your dog the rattlesnake vaccination at the clinic on the same day. I highly recommend the vaccination. I have a friend whose dog was bit at Martinez Lake on the Colorado River and because there was no anti venom available in Yuma or El Centro he had to drive all the way to the emergency clinic in Mission Valley to get his dog treated. The dog survived because it had received the vaccination.

Mark will need some volunteers to help run the clinic so if you plan on being there to get your dog

Additionally, Ruth had this to report:

The annual meeting was well attended and held in conjunction with the Judges Workshop that all active judges are required to attend every three years. There was not much to discuss at the delegates meeting. A discussion was brought forth about using wild birds at the Invitational. There was a scare this year about bird flu and they had to substitute Dokken trading dummies for the retrieve portion of the test. It was a temporary move, one the Executive Council made in order to not cancel the test. They wanted to reassure members that live birds will be used in the future barring any other unforeseen circumstances.

The Midwest Tristate Chapter did a very good job hosting this event. It was well run and well thought out. My hats off to the members for such hard work. There is talk about Arizona hosting the next annual meeting. I understand they may be proposing to host it in Las Vegas—nothing official yet. There are two new western Sr Judges, Mark Krueger from New Mexico and Larry Stone from Oregon. They are both fine judges and an asset to those of us in the West. Dan Wittman was named a judge as well. He is a member of the Arizona Chapter.

I would like to remind every San Diego Chapter Member that High On Kennels is open for you to train at year round. Our chapter has invested \$ to make these grounds useful to us. We have a full pond. It is set up for UT water retrieves and puppy work. You could get a dog started here on duck search. There is not enough cover for a full UT duck search. The main field was planted and should be useable in a couple of months if our El Niño keeps providing us with water. Please call or e-mail me if you would like to train here. I can make the equipment in the NAVHDA trailer available to you and maybe even supply a few birds.

I am once again offering a beginning bird dog class here at High On Kennels. I will be joined By Kassie Boozel and Mike Helms as my assistants this year. They both were part of the first class last year. They both went on to run their pups in NA this year. Class begins March 5th. It will run for 8 Saturday's. The cost is \$600 and includes the birds we use. Class time is 8:00AM til 10:00. There is no limit to how long you stay after class. You are also welcome to come early to air out your dog. I will be limiting class to 10/12 dogs to keep things manageable. Please contact me for any questions or to sign up. Hope to see you there!





Versatile Breed: German Shorthaired Pointer

In less than 50 years the German shorthaired pointer has become one of this country's most popular gun dogs. He earned that reputation gradually--without fanfare or ballyhoo--on his own merits. Despite the popularity and 150plus-year history of the German shorthaired pointer, the origins of this breed are somewhat vague according to Craig Koshyk, author of Pointing Dogs: The Continentals. However, documents do support a fairly definite starting place and time for the beginnings of the breed. In the mid-19th century breeders in Germany set out to deliberately create a gun dog so versatile that it would hunt all species of upland gamebirds and waterfowl as well as all kinds of small game. In addition, this all-around canine would also scent track big game such as wild boar and wounded deer and find and dispatch predators like fox and feral cats when necessary.

The shorthair is capable of a finished performance in a variety of hunting situations. He has a great nose along with



much desire and ability, coupled with speed, stamina, style and guts. Intelligence and desire to please are two of his most valued assets. He is a near-perfect all around gun dog for the foot-hunter as he adapts his range to the cover and the terrain. His versatility in no way interferes with his companionship around the home. His affectionate and playful nature make a big hit with the kids, his intelligence and shorthaired cleanliness is appreciated in the house.
