Versatile Breed: German Longhaired Pointer

The German longhaired pointer was developed in Germany and is used as a multipurpose gundog. It has a strong and well-regarded club (first club established in 1893; all clubs consolidated in 1926) in its homeland, a growing population in North America and even a small but active following on the field trial circuit in the Netherlands, France, and Spain. The breed soon gained a reputation as a tough-as-nails "forester's dog", an excellent water worker, and a calm steady tracker of big game. Compared to its shorthaired and wirehaired cousins, the GLP was consider more of a niche breed like the Weimaraner, valued for its slower, steadier hunting style, strong protective instinct, and sharpness on predators.

The GLP should be muscular, elegant, and athletic. It should not be bulky or cumbersome, and it should move with great speed and freedom. It has moderate but substantial bone and must never look weak or frail. In terms of size, males should be 24-28in and females 23-26in



and GLPs weigh in at approximately 60 pounds. The coat is of medium length and can be solid brown, liver roan, or brown and white in many combinations but never black. The coat is slightly wavy, but must not be curly. It is not silky or soft, but rather firm and shiny. The GLP always has a double coat with the undercoat being quite dense.
